- Where do you think the fine line is drawn between prompting and performing as part of the worship team?
- What specific things could be done to keep the focus off the prompters and onto Christ when being part of leading worship?
- What could we do in corporate worship at Grace Church to become more God-centered, Cross-focused, and participatory?
